2019-2020 Highlights

AMIS's 42nd Annual Welcome Concert and Reception

Was held on September 21 at Spelman College and featured the Morehouse College Glee Club. It was attended by 300 international students and volunteers.

Amigo Friendship Partners Program

Connected 125 international students with 61 local American friends/families.

Thanksgiving Program

Enabled 95 international students to celebrate the holiday with 26 local families.

Atlanta Christmas International House

Hosted 15 international students in 13 local homes for the 10 days of the program (December 18-28, 2019).

AMIS Students

In the 2019-2020 academic year, AMIS served over **400** international students and scholars who were involved in AMIS programs and events. Of these;

- 125 students were enrolled in AMIS's Amigo Friendship Partners program
- **95** students participated in our Thanksgiving Program
- **57** experienced National Christmas International House (15 of these were hosted by us in Atlanta)
- 125 additional students attended
 1 or more AMIS events including the
 Welcome Reception, Hikes, Potluck
 Dinners, AMIS Day, etc.
